John was born in Amsterdam, Holland on 16th February 1943. Holland was under German Occupation at the time. He started school in 1946. His parents seeking a better life for themselves, and John's sister had heard about Australia "The Land of Tomorrow" and decided to emigrate to Australia and they arrived in January 1950. Life for immigrants and their children was tough and his school years in Australia were spent learning to read and write English.

He did well as school and went on to do the Leaving Certificate and won a bursary to go to university where he graduated in 1967 a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

He spent 6 months in Holland with an engineering firm translating documents from Dutch to English. John later went on to complete a Master of Engineering Science which he completed in 1970.

John spent much of his working life undertaking contract work on various projects. At one location he met Margaret who later became his wife.

Always happy despite failing health in recent years, his son told me that Maurie's home was full of items he had crafted at The Shed and said that "dad's times at The Shed were among his happiest".

For several years Maurie took on the task of ensuring that the lunchroom was well stocked with coffee, tea, milk and biscuits and in 2017 was presented with The President's Award for Consistent Performance Above Expectations 'Champion Milk and Biscuit Baron'.

We also presented Maurie with a commemorative plaque on his 90th Birthday as he was at that time our oldest member.
